# Fiscal Implication of Proposed 2022023 CarryForward Budget

#### 19.92 Positions Added in 2022022

Due to anticipated needs in the District, and with the allocation of federal grant funding to schools, the District added 8.0 FTE this school year.

  - Kindergarten Teacher / Elementafty0 FTE
  - Teaching AssistantsHS: 2.0 FTE
  - Teaching Assistants / MS2.0FTE

## 19.92 Positions Added in 2022022 Continued


Due to anticipated needs in the District, an additional 11.92 FTE positions were added to the general fund this school year.

- Positions funded through tgeneral fund:
  - Special Education Instructional:32 FTE
  - Second Grade / Elementary 0 FTE
  - Reading Teacher / Elementary 0 FTE Instructional / Elementary 1.0 FTE

  - Administrator: 1.0 FTE
  - Teaching Aides 2.0 FTE
  - **Buildings & Grounds FTE**

# 2022- 2023 CarryForward Budget

2022– 2023 Carry Forward Budget: \$61,363,360

2021– 2022 Adopted Budget: \$59,127,425

The budgeto-budget calculation reflects what it will cost to maintain our present programs and services in the coming year. Items which may impact the budget budget calculation include contractual costs, salaries, benefits, BOCES expenditures, utilities, and fuel costs.



# The District's Property Tax Levy Limit 2922023


- The District's calculated maximum allowable tax levy limit for 2022-2023 is 1.27%. This means:
  - The allowable levy increase over the 202022
     budget is \$393,021.
  - The first draft budget increase of 3.78% reflects a shortfall of \$1,086, 000...the amount we would need to reduce the car#forward budget by to reach the allowable tax levy limit.
