- we cannot make students pay for school meals we rely on the offices to contact parents
 - To date, we have \$4764 in debt

- HMB Consultants
 - liaison between the district and food service
 - in order to be a reimbursable meal, students need to have certain components to their meals
 - assists with policies and protocols to be in compliance with USDA and NYSED
 - health inspections
 - audit serving lines and the time it takes for students to eat
 - elementary schools have moved to breakfast in the classroom
 - grab and go carts
 - middle school and high school
 - breakfast is served until 9:30am but students are not able to bring breakfast into homeroom or classe. This means we have fewer students who are able to eat breakfast at the secondary level.
 - Drew: perhaps we could do a pilot?
