## Agenda Items

### **Lead in Drinking Water (Jon Van Alstyne)**

- Lead in drinking water testing is required by the New York State Department of Health to be completed in schools by December 31, 2025. Certain water outlets, such as those located in bathrooms, art/science rooms, or any other place determined by the school where they will not be used for drinking and/or cooking do not require testing. “Do not drink” signage is required when water outlets are not tested. Signage is also required if an outlet tests above the permissible limit. The signage essentially takes the outlet “out of service” until remediation can be conducted. Drew mentioned that the district recently replaced fixtures as a capital project. Testing will likely be conducted after July 2025. The state is allowing up to \$10,000 in reimbursable funding for remediation.

### **District-Wide Safety Plan and Building Level Emergency Response Plans (Jon Van Alstyne)**

- The District-Wide Safety Plan (DWSP) and Building Level Emergency Response Plans are still in limbo as the DWSP was recently introduced to the public at the last Board of Education meeting. The plan is now in the mandatory 30-day comment period. Pending the comment period, the plan should be adopted by the Board of Education on December 9<sup>th</sup>. The plans will then be submitted to State Education.

### **AEDs (Jon Van Alstyne)**

- All AEDs have been updated with new batteries and new adult pads. The pediatric pads expire at the end of November so they will be replaced on or about November 20<sup>th</sup>.

## Round Table

### **Building Safety Updates (Drew Giaquinto)**

- Within a week, the district will be submitting plans to State Education regarding security enhancements for the building vestibules and the boiler system at Lincoln. Most principals have met with the architect regarding their vestibule upgrade. The timeline for the vestibules and boiler system is as follows: bids in March, construction during the summer of 2025, and completion by the fall of 2025. A presentation regarding electric busses and the upgrades to the transportation facility was conducted. The cost is \$2.6 million but most of the funding will be reimbursed.
