Mr. Victor Sosnowski of Mayfair Jewelers reached out to retired Technology teacher Patrick Collins to inquire about making a donation to the technology department. He has a Cam Master Panther CNC Router that he no longer uses. The cost of a brand-new machine exceeds \$50,000, and the current value of this used machine is estimated at \$25,000. At my request, current Technology teacher Lance Keating coordinated with Buildings and Grounds Supervisors to inspect the equipment. They will all work together on the delivery logistics of the machine once the Board of Education accepts the donation.

The machine will temporarily be stored in the Auto Shop (Room C2) with an anticipated move into the Wood Shop (Room C5). The existing doorway into the woodshop will need to be widened. No IT support will be necessary as the machine operates on a stand-alone computer. Students will be able to design using Autodesk Inventor and transfer the information to the machine using a Micro USB card. This will be a great addition to the students in this program.
