- ❖ Submit **YOUR OWN PERSONAL ESSAY** (see Page 4 for tips on writing your essay).
- ❖ Be sure to **SIGN YOUR FULL NAME TO EACH ESSAY**.
- ❖ Check each scholarship to see how many letters you need. The counseling Office has a list of recommendation letters submitted through Naviance. However, some scholarships need a non-college recommendation letter (review the requirements for each application carefully).
- ❖ Be certain your resume is updated and print it from Naviance. You may use another version if preferred.
- ❖ Your scholastic record (transcript, report card, etc.) will be prepared by your school counselor.

INFORMATION TO HELP YOU WRITE YOUR PERSONAL ESSAY

A personal essay MUST accompany every scholarship to which you are applying.
You may also be required to submit a specific essay.
Please check scholarship details.

Be sure to sign each of the essays you write.

You may address the essay "Dear Scholarship Committee".

You may write your essay one of three ways:

1. You may write one generic essay that the counseling office will copy for all the scholarships to which you apply.
2. You may address essays to individual scholarships applied for. You may also submit a generic essay for the remaining scholarships.
3. You may address individual essays to each individual scholarship.

You should include in your essay:

1. Information about yourself.
2. Your future plans or goals.
3. How the scholarship will help you achieve your plans or goals.
4. Specific information that some of the scholarships are requesting.
5. Some scholarships may ask your parent to attest to the letter by signing it.
Please have your parent sign your letter, if applicable.
6. Make sure you read the paragraph for each individual scholarship. Some scholarships request specific information.

NOTE – You will need at least one letter of recommendation. Some scholarships require two or three letters. Make sure you check each scholarship to see how many you will need. Check with the counseling office in advance to be certain there are letters on file which can be used for scholarships. The counseling office has a list of the letters submitted through Naviance.
